

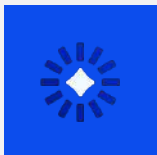

The Frontiers Research Foundation is launching the Frontiers Planet Prize in the area of sustainability science with the goal of accelerating scientific solutions for healthy lives on a healthy planet.

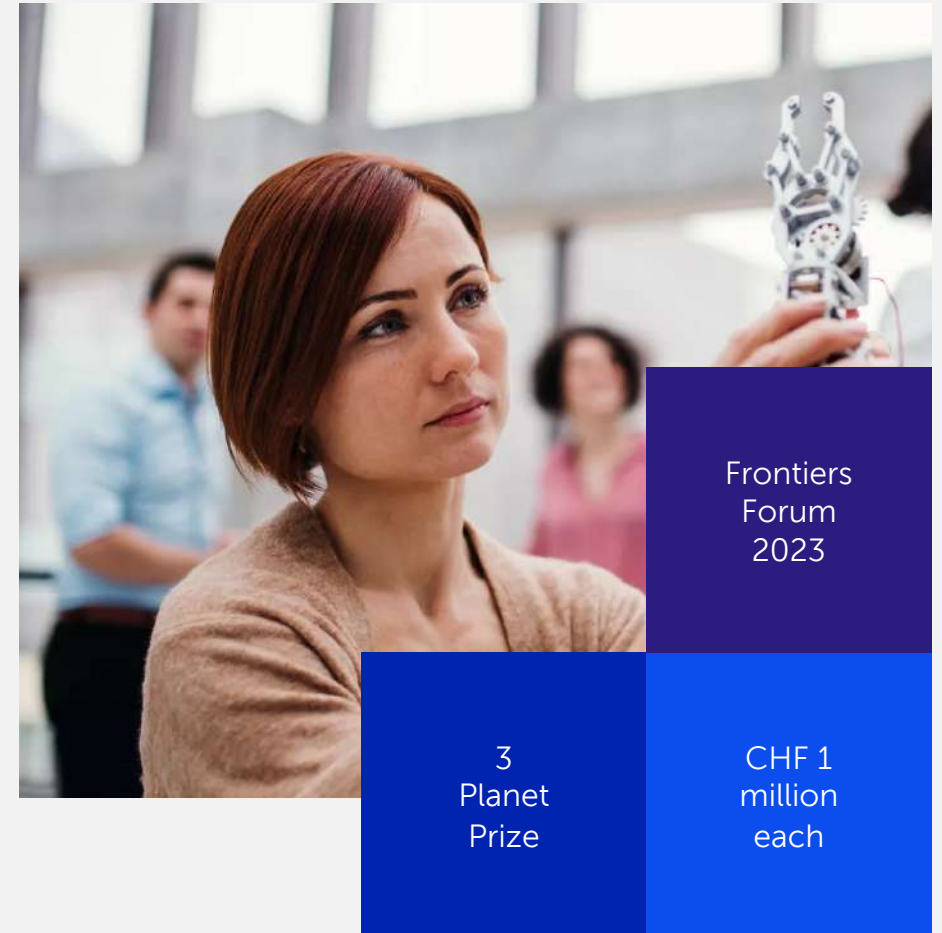
The program will recognize the most important scientific breakthroughs with the greatest potential to stabilize our planet's ecosystem.



About the prize

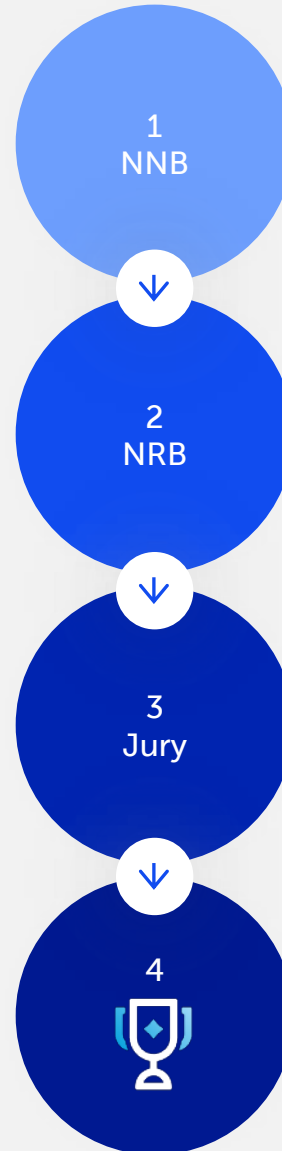
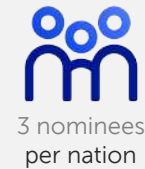
The Frontiers Planet Prize aims to recognize, encourage, and reward exceptional scientists whose work contributes toward a sustainable planet. The ambition of the Foundation is to boost sustainability research and, much like the Olympics, foster a passionate competition between scientists, universities, and nations.

The Frontiers Planet Prize is awarded by the Frontiers Research Foundation based in Switzerland. For its inaugural edition, the Foundation will be awarding **three Planet Prizes of CHF 1 million each**, rewarding breakthrough sustainability science at an awards ceremony that will be held at the **annual Frontiers Forum in Montreux, Switzerland in April 2023**.



How it works

We aim to emulate the passion and pride of the Olympic Games to unleash the competitive spirit of researchers – supported by their universities and national leaders – to ensure the world recognises the urgency of the environmental challenges we face, and the work of the scientists dedicating their lives to finding solutions.



The Prize operates as follows:

- 1 Individual universities or research institutions register as National Nominating Bodies (NNB), which authorizes them to submit three candidates for consideration.
- 2 This pool of candidates is evaluated by a National Representative Body (NRB), typically a national-level learned academy, which selects three National Nominees.
- 3 The Jury, led by Prof Johan Rockström, evaluates the National Nominees based on the importance and relevance of a recently published article and selects one National Champion for each country.
- 4 The Jury selects three International Champions from the National Champions to each win a CHF 1 million prize.

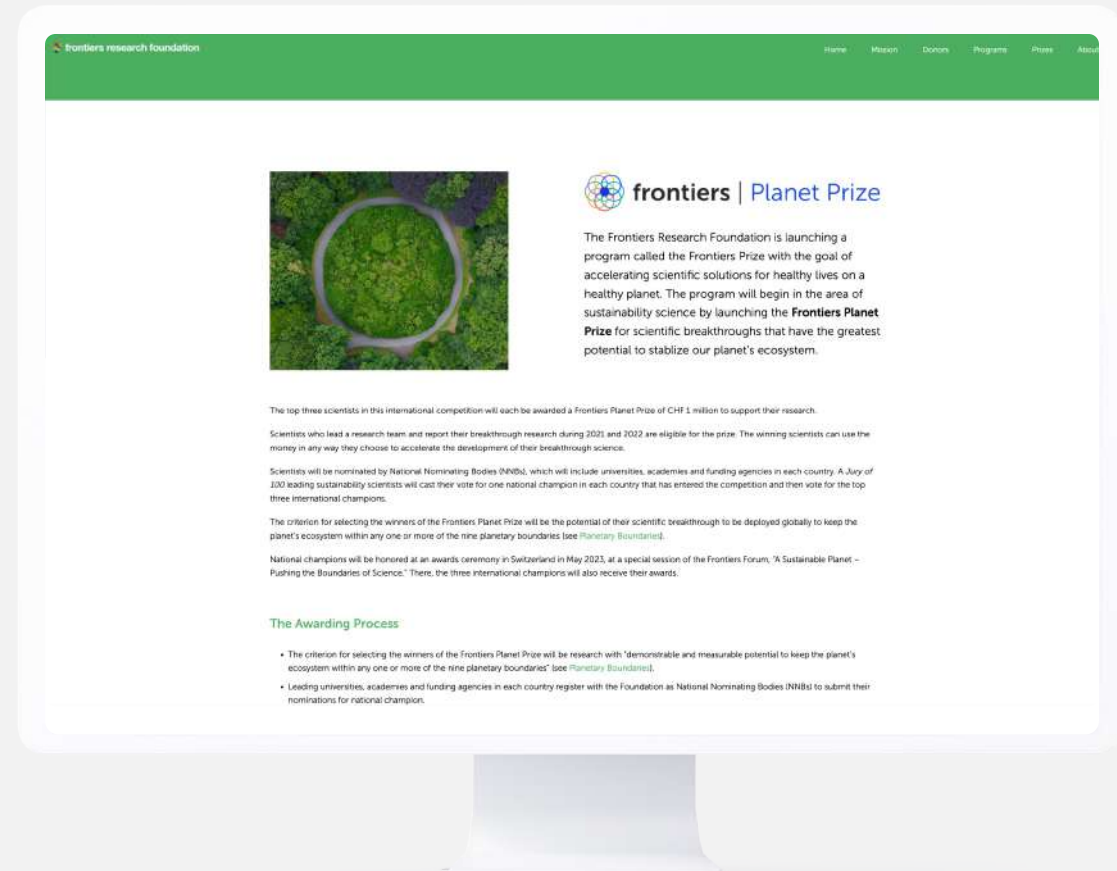
